RULES AND REGULATIONS

- **Erie Hunt and Saddle Club strongly recommends that all horses entering the grounds have a Negative Coggins and current vaccinations recommended for this area.**
- The Erie Hunt & Saddle Club will not be responsible for any damage, injury or loss to persons, animals or property of exhibitors or spectators. Every class offered herein which is covered by the current U.S.E.F. rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith: any class not covered shall have the rules posted in the secretary's office.
- Any horse or rider disrupting a class will be excused from the class.
- Rider's age is determined as of December 1st, of the preceding year.
- Entries may be shown both English and Western with the appropriate tack and attire. All tack changes must be cleared with the announcer and paddock master.
- Stallions are prohibited in classes for Juniors.
- All horses exhibited in breed classes must show papers.
- Hobbles and lariats are optional in Stock Seat classes.
- For lack of entries, the show committee reserves the right to cancel or combine classes as necessary.
- In Equitation classes the rider is being judged, in all others the horse is being judged.
- Food will be available at the club house.
- All dogs must be leashed.
- All riders in over fence classes or schooling must wear U.S.E.F. approved protective headgear: per U.S.E.F. Article 318 No's 2 and 3, (Harness required for Juniors).
- All Junior riders (17 and under) whenever mounted or driving must wear U.S.E.F. approved (harness) headgear.
- Stalls are available (at regular shows) for owner of the horse at \$15.00 members / \$25.00 non-members per day: bedding included. Anyone wishing to reserve a stall must contact the EHSC Stabling Chairman. Stalls may not be claimed prior to 7:00 A.M. on the day of the show except by contacting the Stabling Chairman.
- We reserve the right to change classes as required.
- **Check web site www.ehsc-lhpc.org for corrections or updates**
- Hunter Classes:
 - *Standard nose bands must be used.
 - *Standing martingales are allowed in over fence classes only.
 - *No boots or wraps are allowed.

The E.H.S.C. is a non-profit organization of approximately 200 members, founded in 1962 for the promotion, education and enjoyment of equestrian activities. We own 50 acres on the corner of Eureka and Old State Roads in Franklin Center, just outside Erie, PA. We are easily accessible from interstates 90 and 79.

Our facility is comprised of (2) sand show / Dressage rings, permanent stabling for 100 horses (with running water), a club house with kitchen, both permanent and portable sound systems, stadium fences and a cross country course that can support Novice through Intermediate levels.

We hold a number of horse-related events per summer, including two USEA recognized Horse Trials and a Dressage Show. In addition to the shows we offer clinics throughout the year, contribute to area charities, support our local Pony Club and 4H Clubs.

EHSC general membership meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month and are open to anyone. Our programs include Lectures, films, demonstrations and activities involving all aspects of horse health, care and riding.

We feel there are many organizations, groups and individuals, such as you, who may benefit from an association with the EHSC. Our current member services include free use of grounds and club house with permission of president or vice-president, eligibility for year end awards, reduced rates at certain shows and functions, reduced stabling at most shows, preferential entry for limited entry functions, a monthly news letter and an annual membership directory.

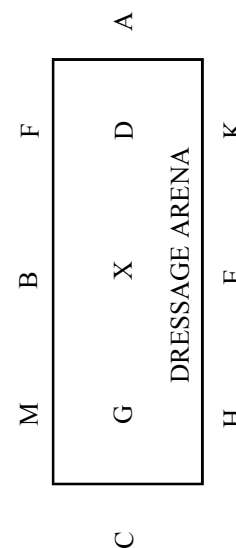

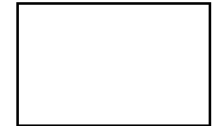

WHAT IS A JUMPING DERBY?

A jumping derby combines stadium jumps (will fall if hit) and cross country obstacles (solid and immovable) that might typically be encountered at an event or horse trials. This is a good test of your horse's willingness to jump a mix of fences over varied terrain.

WHO SHOULD ENTER?

Anybody who events or wants to event can benefit from the jumping derby! Competitors may run the gamut from professionals schooling young horses to seasoned amateurs honing their skills or exploring the idea of moving up a level. It is an excellent opportunity for people interested in eventing to "test the waters" without investing in expensive equipment and clothing. Also, anybody who liked to have fun in a low key, casual atmosphere!

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Generally run according to USEA rules where applicable. The organizer further reserves the right to combine or split classes within the division if entries warrant.

DIVISIONS:

INTRO: MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF FENCES IS 18", MAXIMUM TIME ALLOWED FOR COURSE TBA.

INTRO HORSE: Horse has not competed at this level or has not competed successfully at this level. Experience of rider not considered.

INTRO RIDER: Rider has not competed at this level or has not competed successfully at this level. Experience of horse not considered.

OPEN INTRO: Horse and/or rider may have competed at higher levels in past however, this horse and rider combination may not compete in any other division at this jumping derby. This division may be used as a "do over" for the Intro Horse or Intro Rider classes.

BABY BEGINNER NOVICE: MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF FENCES IS 2'3" SPEED IS 325 MPM. NO WATER CROSSING.

BBN HORSE: Horse has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of rider not considered.

BBN RIDER: Rider has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of horse not considered.

BBN OPEN: Horse and/or rider may have competed at higher levels in the past however, this horse and rider combination may not compete in any other division at this jumping derby. This division may be

used as a "do over" for the BBN Horse or BBN Rider classes.

BEGINNER NOVICE: MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF FENCES IS 2'9" SPEED IS 335 MPM.

BN HORSE: Horse has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of rider is not considered.

BN RIDER: Rider has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of Horse is not considered.

BN OPEN: Horse and/or rider may have competed at this level or higher in the past, however, this horse and rider combination may not compete in any other division at this jumping derby. May be used as a "do over" for the BN Rider or BN Horse classes.

NOVICE: MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF FENCES IS 2'11" SPEED IS 335 MPM.

NOV HORSE: Horse has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of rider is not considered.

NOV RIDER: Rider has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of Horse is not considered.

NOV OPEN: Horse and/or rider may have competed at this level or higher in the past, however, this horse and rider combination may not compete in any other division at this jumping derby. May be used as a "do over" for the NOV Rider or NOV Horse classes.

TRAINING: MAXIMUM HEIGHT OF FENCES IS 3'3" SPEED IS 370 MPM.

TRNG HORSE: Horse has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of rider is not considered.

TRNG RIDER: Rider has not competed at this level or has not won at this level. Experience of Horse is not considered.

TRNG OPEN: Horse and/or rider may have competed at this level or higher in the past, however, this horse and rider combination may not compete in any other division at this jumping derby. May be used as a "do over" for the TRNG Rider or TRNG Horse classes.

HORSES may be competed in more than one division, **HOWEVER,** HORSE AND RIDER COMBINATION MAY NOT CROSSENER DIVISION **AND** MAY COMPETE IN ONLY 2 CLASSES WITHIN THE DIVISION. **NO HORSE MAY BE COMPETED IN MORE THAN 4 CLASSES**

TOTAL. There are no restrictions on the number of classes a rider may enter.

OPTIMUM times are based on USEA rules. Time penalties will be assessed if the optimum time is exceeded.

JUMPING penalties are assessed according to the USEA rules for eventing.

JUMP OFFS: Competitors having no time penalties or jumping faults will go to the jump off round. Jump offs will be run over a shortened course and the fastest time will win. Jump off courses will be announced in advance and will be run after all competitors have gone through the initial round.

COURSES will be open for walking immediately prior to each DIVISION. There will be a break after each division for course adjustment.

ATTIRE: Informal to casual. Breeches with paddock boots and half chaps, or tall leather/rubber boots. Shirts with sleeves. **SEI/ASTM HELMETS AND SAFETY VESTS REQUIRED.** Medical armbands strongly recommended. **ALL MINORS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A PARENT OR DESIGNATED GUARDIAN.**

TACK AND EQUIPMENT: Any English saddle is permitted. Bell boots, splint boots, jumping boots permitted. ONLY RUNNING martingales with rein stops may be used. Short whips, crops or bats permitted.

NO UNAUTHORIZED ASSISTANCE: course must be ridden from memory.

PLACING 1st through 6th place.

FEES: \$30 PER CLASS

\$2 PER RIDER EMT FEE

ENTRIES: ALL ENTRIES MUST BE MADE IN ADVANCE MUST BE POSTMARKED BY SEPTEMBER 20, 2008

HORSE OF THE YEAR: To be awarded to the horse and rider accumulating the most points from any or all performance classes (except as noted in rule 4), excluding games and equitation, of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

PONY OF THE YEAR: To be awarded to the pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all performance classes (except as noted in rule 4), excluding games and equitation, of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

WESTERN PLEASURE HORSE: To be awarded to the horse and rider accumulating the most points from any or all Western Pleasure classes of any competition sponsored by the EHSC (except as noted in rule 4), within the calendar year.

ENGLISH PLEASURE HORSE: To be awarded to the horse and rider accumulating the most points from any or all English Pleasure classes of any competition sponsored by the EHSC (except as noted in rule 4), within the calendar year.

GAME HORSE OR PONY: To be awarded to the horse / pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all game classes of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

PLEASURE PONY: To be awarded to the pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all Pleasure classes of any competition sponsored by the EHSC (except as noted in rule 4), within the calendar year.

SADDLE SEAT HORSE OR PONY: To be awarded to the horse / pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all Saddle Seat or English Pleasure classes (Excluding Equitation) of any competition sponsored by the EHSC (except as noted in rule 4), within the calendar year.

HUNT SEAT EQUITATION: (Juniors) To be awarded to the rider accumulating the most points from any Hunt Seat Equitation classes, whether on the flat or over fences, of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

STOCK SEAT EQUITATION: (Juniors) To be awarded to the rider accumulating the most points from any Stock Seat Equitation classes of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

ADULT EQUITATION - HUNT / SADDLE / STOCK SEAT: To be awarded to the rider accumulating the most points from any Adult Equitation classes (18 years and over) of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

WALK TROT: To be awarded to the horse / pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all Walk Trot classes of any competition sponsored by the EHSC within the calendar year.

JUMPING AWARD : (Junior and Senior) To be awarded to the horse / pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all over fences classes (excluding equitation classes) of any competition sponsored by the EHSC (except as noted in rule 4), within the calendar year.

EVENT RIDER : (Junior and Senior) To be awarded to the horse / pony and rider accumulating the most points from any EHSC or Lost Hounds Horse Trials within the calendar year.

DRESSAGE RIDER : (Junior and Senior) To be awarded to the horse / pony and rider accumulating the most points from any or all EHSC or Lost Hounds Event Dressage Division or Dressage Show within the calendar year.

HULL CUP: To be awarded to a member each year for outstanding service to the EHSC.

E.H.S.C. YEAR END AWARD RULES

1. No horse or pony may accumulate points at any event unless the completed registration form and the registration fee for such horse, pony or rider has been received by the Awards Chairperson prior to entering the ring in a class for which the horse, pony or rider may collect points.
2. To qualify for performance awards the horse / pony must belong to an EHSC member or a member of an EHSC family. To qualify for Equitation awards, the rider must be an EHSC member or a member of an EHSC family. To be eligible for any year end awards a fee of \$15.00 must be made prior to showing .
3. A horse / pony may have different owners during the year. Only points collected while the horse / pony is registered with the EHSC shall count towards year end awards. If both owners have registered the animal, then points collected under each ownership shall be counted.
4. Points may be collected at all EHSC shows, Dressage Competitions, Horse Trials and Hunter Paces. No points shall be allowed in halter classes or classes limited to a particular breed or breeds. Each test in a Dressage Competition and each Division in a Horse Trials will be treated as a class in a horse show. Hunter Pace points will apply to only Horse or Pony of the year awards. Points from open classes will be applied to the appropriate award.
5. Horse or Pony and rider shall be assigned a number for the entire show. If someone other than the registered rider is to ride the horse or pony they must use a different number. The name of the registered horse / pony must be maintained for the entire show season.
6. All trophies are challenge trophies. The Equitation and Eventing Trophies may be retired if won by the same rider 3 times. The Horse, Pony and Jumping awards may be retired if won by the same horse / pony 3 times. Retired trophies will be replaced by the person retiring the trophy.
7. Winners or their representative must be present to accept their awards at the EHSC Awards Banquet in the fall of the year.
8. Riders age is determined as of December 1st of the previous year. Horses is determined as of January 1st of this year.

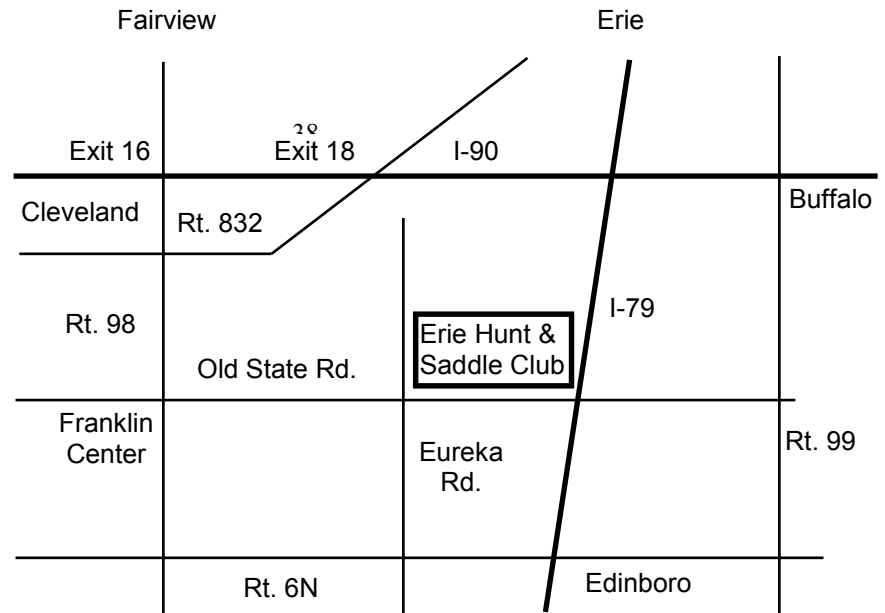
